

## July 24<sup>th</sup>, 2024 NBNA Board Meeting

Board Meeting was called to order at 7 PM.

We have members 155 members and 16 associate members.

The speed radar trailer stopped working the last few days and it will be removed soon to another place.

Kim requested another quarterly incident report from undersheriff and will release to neighborhood watch.

Website needs edited to remove Ellen Boggs, update year terms, and Kim & Sue still need a bio.

Approved minutes from last meeting.

\$1000 donation from the fire department at the annual meeting gave us a nice boost.

4<sup>th</sup> of July seemed a little quieter this year and less fireworks set off in yards. The city had signs posted no fireworks in city limits and think it helped.

The county is paying for thar garbage at the jetty parking lot and they said they will increase the size of the can if we felt it was needed. They also said if cleanup in the area is needed, to let them know. Maybe as we develop a relationship with the head of county parks, Dan Keyes, we can ask about the light pol electricity bill to be covered by them as well as re-gravelling the parking lot.

The annual meeting went well. Members voiced some concerns and we had some volunteer sign ups, as well as more membership dues paid for.

We need someone on the board who could act as a volunteer coordinator.

Tom reached out to two volunteer signups for evacuation trail stairs & rope and post help.

Two signups for refreshing the Nedonna entrance sign – Tom will decide a date for the fall.

Three Walkadonna signup volunteers.

Ann Laskey is interested in assisting to coordinate speed sign art projects with Kim and the middle school.

Scotchbroom will continue to be an easy volunteer project for the schools, as well as littler cleanup, and hopefully speed signs in the art room.

Tom will get measurements for the Nedonna Beach banner. Board to review verbiage on the sign, with our logo and website... possibly a QR code.

Two Walkadonna meetings: there are two meetings scheduled so far and Tom and Sydney will be able to attend two of them. Sydney will work on getting out some emails and FB post.

TC4 wants to know what our vision and mission are.

Nedonna development on Kittiwake and Riley has preliminary approval from the city. The city has given a list of 22 checklist items the developer needs to do in order to develop. There is a petition going around to get an ordinance for no development on wetlands.

Kim will look into attending a Salmonberry Trail meeting.

City strategic planning – we have been asked what we would want in Nedonna if the city partnered with us. It has been historically difficult to work with the city because of the turnover rate of contacts at the city. There is a void when new contracts start and we are not reintroduced. A survey for Nedonna members may be coming.

There will be a focus group and present findings in September.
